If you missed the opportunity to be at the meeting, don't miss the opportunity to view the recording. David's presentation starts at the 39:06 minute mark.



He was one of three founders of the Cambridge Sports Hall of Fame in 1996, along with Al Findlay and Cam Allan. David is still on the board. More than 200 members have been inducted including some who are members of PROBUS.

Over the years, he won various newspaper awards including a Milt Dunnell Award for sports and another for a heritage feature story about Marion Tait.

He is also the author of the sports book 'Terrier Town: Summer of '49', published in 2003 by Wilfrid Laurier University Press.

A U of W Engineering grad, he worked at Babcock & Wilcox for 40 years holding 15 positions from Business Planning to International Service and Construction. Focussing on Business Development Project Management from the very small (nanocrystalline Inconel weld overlay) to the very large (3 x 160 megawatt boilers, 166 ft tall in Venezuela).

Married in 1972 to Sue a Nurse, they raised Andrew (Kinesiologist and Health & Wellness Manager, Gillian (Nurse Manager and Coach) and Geoff (Electrical and Computer Engineer managing safety critical graphics systems). All have married and are raising 6 grandchildren for Keith and Sue's enjoyment.

Keith enjoys a lifelong interest in vocal choir music having performed Handel's Messiah in Carnegie Hall and Photography having provided photos and game reports for Waterloo Warriors CIS Men's Hockey. Playing hockey continues currently, having played 5



years ago in the world old timers' classic tournament in Helsinki Finland 50+ division.

Community volunteering projects include church work (establishing Interfaith Pastoral Counselling), Kiwanis (chairs the first International Festival Parade), West Galt Neighbourhood Association (steering committees), House of Friendship (Close to Home new Addiction Treatment facility Cambridge Campaign lead), Citizens for Cambridge (management committee to establish Cambridge Neighbourhood Table, to bring Indwell supportive housing to Preston, and to plan for an affordable housing over parking lots pilot).



Keith credited life's opportunities to our terrific community and the help and support of countless others without whom his role could not be possible. He noted retirement has produced grey power, a force to be reckoned with, and recognized the collective wisdom in the room. He encouraged everyone to remain healthy through active community engagement and concluded: "May the Force be with you!"


Neil was a Banker for 32 years at TD Canada Trust before retirement last summer.

Membership Committee






