Our guest speaker was Dr. Asa Ahimbisibwe

Despite the extreme poverty he encounter when growing up in Uganda, where education is more of a privilege than priority, his parents decided to break the cycle to give him the chance to pursue his wish to become a doctor.

He shared his story as a tribute to his parents.

Dr. Ahimbisibwe described the challenges he and his family faced and told of many people that helped him along the way. We all gained a better understanding about how another part of the world lives and how through determination, one can find success.

The struggle was much more than monetary, there were also social pressures to be overcome.


His parents succeeded in giving the gift of education. Dr. Ahimbisibwe has no doubt that this was a key part of his success.

His family, originally ridiculed, achieved respect. Dr. Ahimbisibwe pointed out that education transforms not only the one who has it.




cousin who, born in disadvantaged villages in Uganda, embark on the uphill task of changing their lives, but end up in completely different places.


Our October 25 meeting is our annual salute to Veterans and our speaker will be John Boyko
