President's Message: December 2021

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, 2021 continued to be a very challenging year for our PROBUS Clubs across the country. A few clubs were able to hold in-person meetings, some were offering “hybrid meetings” and many continued to offer monthly Zoom Meetings.

Your Board of Directors was very busy this year in both Committee and full Board Meetings. In August the Board of Directors approved the “Standard Constitution for PROBUS Clubs, 2021” and the “Suggested Bylaws for PROBUS Clubs, 2021”. The Board Directors’ Manual was approved during a Hybrid Meeting in October as was the Board’s Strategic Plan, October 2021-October 2024. A Board Committee has been working on a Club Guide and Clubs across Canada were asked for input as to what information they would like to have included in this helpful document. The Board hopes to have this Club Guide ready for distribution to our Member Clubs in early 2022.

During its October Meeting the Board of Directors decided to change PROBUS MONTH celebrations from March/April to October of each year. PROBUS MONTH was suggested by Steve Campbell in 2013. Our next PROBUS MONTH celebrations will take place in October of 2022. This will coincide with the “Canadian National Seniors Day” (October 1st) and the “International Day of Older Persons” that was established by the United Nations Member States and was first celebrated on October 1st, 1991. It is observed by all United Nation Member States. Each year has a theme. The theme for 2021 was “Digital Equity for All Ages”.

PROBUS LAPEL PINS

Regular PROBUS lapel pins are \$5.50 each in orders of less than 25 but only \$4.50 each in orders of 25 or more. The 5, 10, 15, 20 and 25 year pins are \$5.50 each regardless of number ordered and the President pin, the Past President pin and the PROBUS CANADA pin are \$8.00 each regardless of the number ordered. The price includes taxes and shipping cost.

Pins are shipped with an invoice and return envelope. They usually take a week to ten days for delivery.
